

THE ITINERARY

Ahoy, fellow sea wanderers! Our course is charted with respect for April's prevailing winds and tides, but mind ye, we're ever watchful of the skies and ready to trim our sails to the whims of Neptune. Our Trip Leader, a true salt, will steer us true, making savvy calls with the wind in our hair and the brine on our faces to keep our journey both shipshape and jolly.

Now, these waters we're setting course for, they're not for your greenhorn sailors. We're talking a Level 3 Sailing Destination, mates.



That's a fair step above the calm seas of the British Virgin Islands and Croatia, those Level 1 havens, and even Greece at Level 2. But fear not! With MSC's crackerjack captains at the helm, all of whom are ASA Instructors no less, you'll be navigating these bountiful seas with the confidence of an old hand.

Our flotilla will be dropping anchor at a string of bays and coves, each more captivating than the last. We're in for a proper sailor's holiday, with the charter life coursing through the veins of these islands. Fancy a bite at a local eatery, a dive beneath the waves, a ramble ashore, or a hunt for treasures in the markets? You'll find it all here where the charter trade is king.

DAY 2 – Thursday, April 3rd: Rodney Bay to Sainte-Anne, Martinique ~23nm

As the first light of daybreak spills over the deck, you'll awaken aboard your trusty yacht, the gentle rocking a balm for any remnants of jet lag. 'Tis a new morn, and with it comes the division of duties amongst the crew. Some hands will take to the task of tallying and stowing our provisions, marking each item as if it were treasure. Others will set to foot for the local markets, seeking fresh victuals and spirits for those inclined to a nip of courage.

Our Trip Leaders and Bareboat Skippers will convene for the sacred rituals of chart, weather, and safety briefings, ensuring no wisdom of the previous day was left unheeded. The eastern trade wind will be our companion as we set a close reach course, slicing through the waves for 20+ nautical miles. The mountainous embrace of Martinique will soon shelter us from the Atlantic's swell.

This "shakedown cruise" will see the crew and vessel become one, a dance of sea and sail. We'll claim a mooring ball off the sandy shores of Sainte Anne, a town as delightful as it is serene, and there we'll rest under the watchful guard of a sandy bottom anchorage, a bulwark against the easterly winds.

From the deck, let your gaze wander to Pointe Marin's beach, a golden strip of sand stretching over a kilometer, from Sainte Anne's anchorage to Club Med Les Boucaniers, Martinique. Near our anchorage, tread lightly through the coconut grove, drink in the verdant hues, and delight in the birds' spirited song. The beaches invite leisure, while the Piton de Crève Cœur, Martinique's mythical volcano, calls to the hearts of hikers.

🍽 🌜 An Evening Feast: Sainte Anne's Culinary Delights 🕬

As twilight descends, the town and beachfront come alive with the promise of culinary adventure. Restaurants aplenty, from the heart of Sainte Anne to the sands by Club Med, offer sustenance for the body and soul.

So, my hearty crew, let us embrace this journey with sails unfurled and hearts open to the wonders of the sea and shore. Onward to the horizon, where adventure and tranquility await in equal measure. $\ddagger \uparrow \uparrow \circ$

2 hr Sailing Time

DAY 3 – Friday, April 4: Sainte-Anne to Grand Anse d'Arlet, Martinique ~14nm

We'll weigh anchor come mid-morn, settin' course for a 5.3-league jaunt (14 NM) up Martinique's flowerkissed west shore. She's the queen of the Windwards, French through-and-through, save for a few British spells. Roads as fine as Paris and a bustling trade she boasts. Every cove's got a sturdy dock for your tender, courtesy of the crown.

A scant couple bells' sailin' with the sun still high, we'll berth at Grande Anse d'Arlet. A quaint hamlet, white sands at her feet, mighty peaks at her back. We'll drop the hook or snag a mooring, just a stone's throw from the beach.

Grand Anse d'Arlet, a jewel among beach towns, offers pleasures for every soul. Claim a patch of golden shore, bathe in the tranquil sea. Taverns and inns dot the coast, and there's art to be found inland. But make no mistake, the beach is king here. Once ye set foot, ye'll be bewitched – that's a sailor's word.

DAY 4 – Saturday, April 5: Grand Anse d'Arlet, Martinique to Anse Mitan, Martinique ~6 nm

After breakfast and a final stroll on Grand Anse d'Arlet's sands, we'll chart a course for Anse Mitan on Martinique's southwest edge. Drop anchor for the afternoon and evening at this palm-fringed haven, where clear waters and charming eateries await just steps from the shore.



Feast on fresh-caught seafood or dive into

snorkeling adventures teeming with marine life. When night falls, head a mile and a half to Trois Ilets. The Casino Trois-Ilets, styled after New Orleans' French Quarter, offers roulette, stud poker, craps, live music, dancing, and fine dining.

DAY 5 – Sunday, April 6: Anse Mitan, Martinique to St Pierre, Martinique ~16 nm

Ahoy! Saint-Pierre, a wee town on Martinique's northwest, lies at the foot of the notorious Mt Pelee. This spot's a gem on our West Indies Odyssey charter. Over a century ago, a volcanic blast leveled it, but she's been rebuilt around her old bones. Stroll through untouched ruins, then hit the museum. Feel the black sand 'tween your toes or sail a few hundred yards out to marvel at over 10 shipwrecks, now under no-anchor protection. Aye, it's a sailor's delight!



DAY 6 – Monday, April 7: St Pierre, Martinique to Marigot Bay, St Lucia ~48 nm

Ahoy, matey! Not your usual Monday, but an early start nonetheless. We'll hoist the sails at dawn, leaving Martinique's French flair behind, and head south to St Lucia, with Marigot Bay as our next port-of-call. Brace yerself for the mighty Tradewinds and thrilling speeds on a beam-reach point-of-sail. Marigot Bay offers a snug anchorage and a new marina. The town's a



beauty, with charming wooden architecture and a posh, eco-friendly resort boasting a top-notch spa. Expect a hearty welcome at the classic Caribbean bars and eateries. Anchors aweigh!

DAY 7 – Tuesday, April 8: Marigot Bay, St Lucia to Piton Bay, St Lucia ~11nm



Following a lazy morn, we'll weigh anchor and sail south to the striking twin peaks of Gros Piton and Petit Piton, true icons of the Caribbean and UNESCO treasures. We'll snag a mooring ball in this marine reserve, giving ye the rest of the day to catch the sunset, and the whole next day to bask in the sunrise and sunset while exploring this Caribbean jewel. Aye, it's a sight to behold!

DAY 8 – Wednesday, April 9: Layover Day

After a week of daily sailing, ye'll have a full day

and night to dive into shoreside and seaside adventures. Hike, snorkel, scuba dive, soak in hot mud baths at the sulfur springs, wander through lush tropical gardens, or simply relax on the beach. Fancy a stroll? Head into the town of Soufrière. For the hearty hikers, scaling the 2,619-foot (798-meter) Gros Piton, the mightier of the volcanic peaks, will be a thrilling challenge. Aye, there's plenty to keep ye busy!.



DAY 9 – Thursday, April 10: Piton Bay, St Lucia to Anse Cochon Beach, St Lucia ~5 NM

We'll weigh anchor from Piton Bay and chart a northbound course for a short sail to Anse Cochon Beach. There, we'll snag a mooring ball or drop anchor in this Caribbean treasure. Ashore, perched on the cliffside above Anse Cochon cove, lies Ti Kaye, a quaint cottage resort. The resort boasts restaurants, bars, a pizzeria, beach cabanas, a spa, and a wine cellar with occasional by reservation. They also offer scuba diving and can arrange tours



and excursions. Outside guests are welcome when there's room, by reservation. This cove also offers some of the finest snorkeling along St. Lucia's western coast and the Windward Islands. Aye, it's a sailor's paradise!



DAY 10 – Friday, April 11: Anse Cochon Beach, St. Lucia to Pigeon Island, St. Lucia ~17 NM

After greeting another stunning sunrise and enjoying a lazy morning, we'll set sail north for a short and pleasant jaunt to Pigeon Island. It's the perfect spot to drop anchor for the night, nestled in a sheltered cove along a wave-kissed white sand beach. The waters here are clear and calm, ideal for swimming and snorkeling. Ashore, you'll find a mix of restaurants, bars, and resorts to

explore. If ye fancy a hike, trek through Pigeon Island National Park for breathtaking views across Rodney Bay to the distant peaks. Aye, it's a sailor's dream!

DAY 11 – Saturday, April 12: Rodney Bay, Marina – Disembark and Farewell

After a light breakfast, we'll make a short sail back to our base in Rodney Bay, where we'll disembark from our trusty yachts. We'll reflect on our adventures among some of the world's most beautiful islands. With a treasure chest of memories filled with sailing escapades, tropical sunsets, and newfound mates, we'll each chart our own course—whether for a few days' layover or a return to the States. Aye, it's been a voyage to remember!

TRAVEL ARRANGEMENTS

You are responsible for booking your own airfare. Airfare pricing is presently running \$600 to \$1000 per person. If you would like to use a travel agent to book your flights, we suggest Bob Entwisle at E&E Travel, (415) 819-5665, or email bobetravels@gmail.com. If you plan on arriving early or spending a few extras at the conclusion of the voyage, there are many lodging options available on St. Lucia.

WHAT TO BRING

Passport

We will be traveling to St. Lucia and Martinique. There is no visa required for US citizens but check with your state department if you are traveling from a different country. Please ensure your passport is current and will not expire for at least six months after the conclusion of trip.

Luggage

We suggest traveling light. Your gear should fit in a medium duffel bag and a small carry-on bag. Your carryon should be less than 15 pounds. We recommend using a dry bag or backpack. Both bags should be collapsible for easy stowage on the boat in a small space. Do not bring bags with hard frames as they are difficult to stow.

Gear

We have found that people often only use about half of what they bring. A great way to bring only what you use is to lay all your items out and reduce it by 50%. Lay them out again and then reduce again. Gear weight depends on weather conditions of course, but lightweight layering pieces made of moisture-wicking fabric that will dry quickly is essential. Your total gear weight should be less than 55lbs, including carry-on.

Sun conditions can be very different than in San Francisco Bay. Consider lightweight clothing that covers exposed areas without adding bulk or weight. There are a variety of lightweight pants, shirts, and blouses that provide UV protection. Sunscreen and hats are essential.

What Not to Bring

Different states and countries have different travel rules, regulations, and considerations. If you have specific questions about an item, ask us. Some general items you should **not** bring are illegal drugs, weapons, hair dryers, expensive jewelry, pets, rigid suitcases, surfboards, golf clubs (it has happened), fireworks, and dive tanks. Linens, towels, and pillows are provided on each boat and are not necessary to bring.

Considerations

The charter base will typically provide fins, but we encourage you to bring your own mask and snorkel. There are PFDs (life jackets) provided onboard the boat, however, you are more than welcome to bring your own. Note, you'll need to check with your airline on their rules when it comes to traveling with an inflatable PFD.

WEATHER

The weather in the West Indies Islands is beautiful yearround. The month of April is characterized by an average high temperature of 87°F with a low temperatures average 74°F, although there can be a chill in the air when it rains.

The West Indies Islands have two seasons, and the most common forms of precipitation are brief squalls or thunderstorms. March and April are least rainy months of the year with 3.5" of per month and an average of 10 days per month with some precipitation. The islands will still be lush and green at this time of the year.

The average water temperature in April is a warm and inviting 81°F, so plan on enjoying the water with the more than 8 hours of daylight this time of year.



WIND CONDITIONS, CURRENTS, TIDES

In April, trade winds are out of the east at 10 to 25 knots and can occasionally get stronger, building to 30 knots. Strong winds may impact our itinerary. It is usually an easy sail south and north, with the generally consistent trade winds out of the east. If conditions are windier than average, we may shift our itinerary to accommodate the conditions.

GALLEY AND PROVISIONING

Provisioning will be discussed at the crew meeting. Initial menus will be made for staples. Provisioning for breakfast, lunch, and snacks will be done in advance through the charter company and are included in the cost of the trip for the club boats. We will assist bareboat skippers in planning for their charters. Additional provisioning will depend on crews' desires. Final provisioning will be completed once we arrive at the charter base in Rodney Bay, St. Lucia.

Rodney Bay, St. Lucia has several full-service markets and there are a variety of small shops for provisioning needs. Each skipper will work with participants to select items to appeal individual tastes on board. It is a charming experience to wander through a Caribbean grocery store and see what fresh specialty items are available. Recognize that all retail goods must be shipped to the islands, so costs can be higher than you might expect.



Each boat is fully equipped with:

- Three-burner gas stove and oven with outdoor charcoal grill
- Refrigerator with separate freezer drawer
- Comfortable salon seating area
- Storage cabinets for provisions
- Cooking pots and pans

The crew will decide on how many meals they plan on eating ashore and provision accordingly. Food and beverage costs vary based on individual crews' desires. Breakfast, lunch, snacks, and one dinner will be provisioned through SunSail on club boats. Additional meals will be decided upon and purchased as a collective by the crew, depending on tastes.

Global Destinations recognizes that people have different experiences and tastes in personal beverages (alcohol) and provisioning time will be provided for members to make their own purchases. One or two crew members are assigned to stowing the provisions.

While galley duty is a shared responsibility, those who inventory the provisions can help others to find stored items. Each boat will set up their own cooking and cleaning schedules based on crew expectations and experience.

Special Dietary Needs

The Trip Leader(s) and skippers will consult with participants at the crew meeting regarding advanced provisioning. This is your opportunity to let them know if you have specific dietary needs or restrictions. We can plan to accommodate you. If there are unique items you desire, you will have time to purchase them during the provisioning trip.

Breakfast

Breakfast will typically be between 7:00 AM to 9:00 AM each day on club boats, with flexibility based on the itinerary, group, and individual desires. We have enjoyed full course breakfasts, complete with bacon, eggs, et cetera. We have also enjoyed granola bars and fruit, depending on the crew.

The goal is to meet your needs so you will have energy to enjoy the rest of your day.



Lunches

Lunches are very casual with no set schedule. They can be soup and sandwiches, salads, veggie sticks, or local fare. Lunch is often served under way and conditions may dictate what we have on a particular day. If the crew agrees, and a nice lunch spot is found, we can dinghy ashore to eat at a local restaurant or picnic on the beach.

Snacks

Snacks are always a very personal thing and whatever the crew desires. Sometimes they can be chips and salsa or cheese and crackers. Fresh fruit and nuts are always good (and delicious), as they require little to no preparation and help maintain energy.

Dinners

Dinners provide the most flexibility. We can choose to relax on board, cook and watch the sunset, or go ashore and sample the local culture and cuisine. When we make provisioning plans, at least one dinner meal on board needs to be included so that if we find a secluded anchorage and decide not to move, we can remain to enjoy the peace and serenity. The local watering holes and restaurants lend to much of the Caribbean's charm. If available, eating lobster on the beach is a must-do activity.

Dinner Ashore

If we choose to go ashore in the evening, meal costs will be the responsibility of each person. Usually, most establishments will be willing to split checks. Be sure to carry some cash with you as small "mom and pop" places only accept cash.

Perishables

Over the years, we have discovered that some items have a very short shelf life in the marine environment. We will try to anticipate this by acquiring the fewest possible perishables and restock enroute. Often, we come across fresh fish on the docks or at open markets. There is nothing as delicious as fresh seafood caught that very day.
